RPCVSF Goes to Thailand October 27 – November 9, 2019

The fearless Greg Zell (RPCV Nigeria) will lead a group to Thailand for two weeks this fall. This is a rare trip of the entire country at a **four-star** level. It has been put together by the established Thai travel agency, <u>UME Travel</u>.
