RPCVSF Goes to Paris



Travel has confirmed an **eight-day package to Paris** September 16–24, 2019. The trip is perfect for new visitors to France, and travelers have the option to customize the trip as to sights, hotels, and out of town excursions for a more comprehensive experience with Travel's assistance. The group will be staying in a **four-star hotel** in the best location available at the time of booking. As of now, this is the **Villa Beaumarchais** in the Marais, home of the Picasso Museum, Place des Vosges, and Victor Hugo Museum.

On the itinerary are **many Parisian hotspots**: the Louvre; Musee d'Orsay; L'Orangerie; Rodin Museum; Place des Vosges and Victor Hugo museum; Arc de

Triomphe; Latin Quarter; Napoleon's tomb; and Notre Dame, to the extent allowed.
