What Do You Think About Peace Corps & The New Logo?

Recently, I visited the Senator Rubio's Office to meet Ms. Jeanette Rubio with NPCA President Glenn Blumhorst. We have visited several public offices over the past few years to remind them of the value of Peace Corps and to encourage full and increased funding. We are able to share personal stories like when was serving in Niger, West Africa a 98% Muslim country on September 11th when the world changed. I served over the following year when propaganda in the form of t-shirts and posters would applaud the leaders of the devastating attack. There were about 150 of us in country at the time and just about every single one of us had to educate our new colleagues, friends and family about what this propaganda meant. The affect: just as quickly as the materials arrived, we never saw them again. Our new families and friends informed the buyers, and the market place and stood with us against terror. We were able to have these conversations with genuine concern, personal stories, and care for each other. This is the power of the Peace Corps. To put things into perspective the Peace Corps entire requested budget is just under \$500 million; equivalent to one F/A-18 Hornet and an F-22, half a luxury cruise ship, or enough cash to provide 46.5 million people food through food pantries and meal programs. Another area of business we covered on these meetings is the ability to add the "Peace Corps" logo to our grave sites when we all move on. Apparently, there is no provision currently allowing for it. I believe that will change soon, but I am wondering, Peace Corps just changed their logo, so does that mean the old logo is fair game for headstones? And if so which one would you don for all eternity? The RPCVSF logo is a reflection of the old logo, so do we now update our logo. There is a lot to say about Peace Corps and our service.
